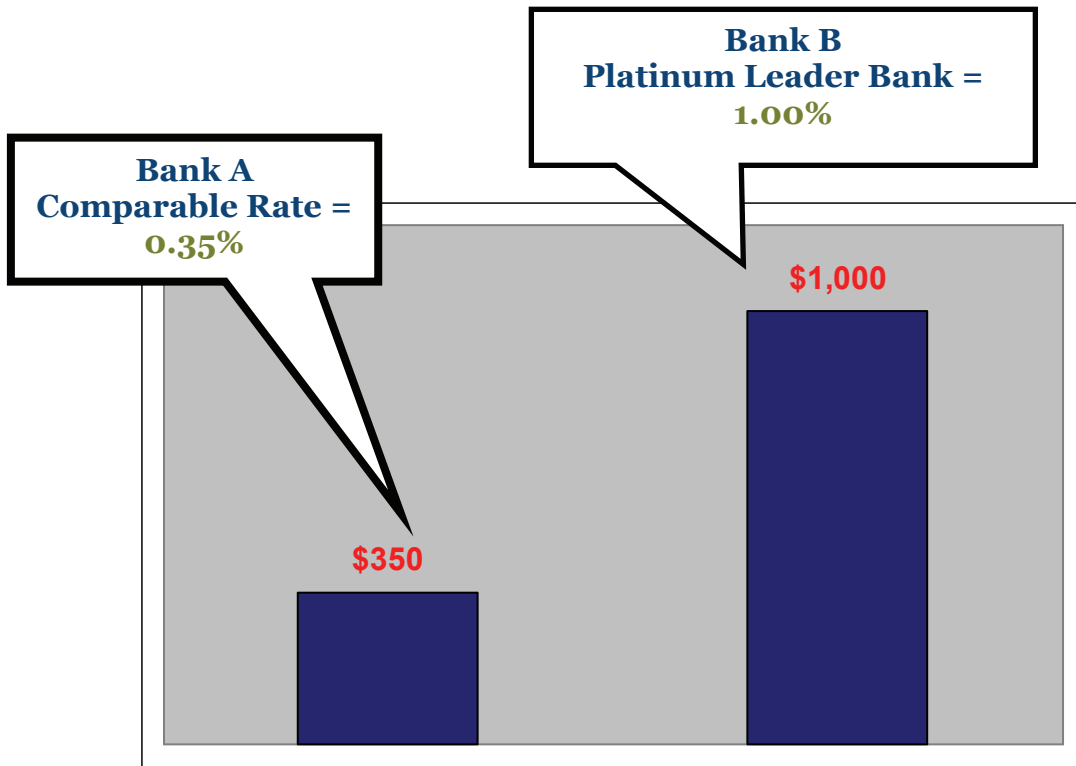

Banking on Justice

The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania requires attorneys to place IOLTA accounts at banks that pay interest rates comparable to rates paid on other similarly situated accounts. More than 250 banks are eligible to hold IOLTA accounts but the banks listed below have agreed to pay premium yields on IOLTA accounts. This means more funding for legal aid. As of 2010, Platinum Leader Banks are paying the higher of 75% of the Federal Funds Target Rate or 1%. The Pennsylvania IOLTA Board thanks all eligible banks, especially the Platinum Leaders who are surpassing eligibility requirements.
